The Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) has instructed each district to develop a plan to support three models of learning for school year 20-21:

- 100% In-Person
- Hybrid
- 100% Remote

Feasibility Study: Examine scheduling, safety, operational, and instructional responsibilities for each of these three models, and perform a pressure test to determine space constrictions related to social distance parameters.
