MassHire Cape & Islands Workforce Board Virtual Meeting via Zoom Meeting Minutes from September 24, 2020

Meeting was called to Order by Chris Richards, CIWB Chair at 8:01 (this included a roll call as meeting was held virtually)

Review and Acceptance of the June Minutes - Bev/Melissa

Treasure's Report & Monthly Financial Update – David Sampson provided an overview of the CIWB finances, which included the specific work the CIWB Finance Committee had been doing over the summer to prepare for the upcoming fiscal year.

MassHire Cape & Island Career Center – Kris Dower provided an overview of the services that are being provided by the MassHire Cape & Islands Career Center. The career center has continued to provide services to both job seekers and employers despite being closed to foot-traffic. The career center will continue to offer workshops, however, they will now be held virtually. The career center will also be holding future job fairs by remote participation.

MassHire CIWB Youth Report — Ken Jenks provided an update on the Connecting Activities Program. Which included a discussion on how schools will continue to offer career awareness education, exploration and immersion experiences while dealing with the pandemic. How impactful and necessary virtual services have become.

Financial Literacy Tool Kit Update – Samantha Fonseca provided an overview on the newly created CIWB Financial Literacy Tool, which is geared towards students in grades 9-12. The tool kit will be launched during STEM week, which will be held October 19 – 23. The CIWB partnered with an educator from Lowell HS for this initiative, who was recommended from Dr. Kerry Akasian. This was possible due to the reallocation of DESE funding.

CIWB Executive Director Report:

Healthcare HUBS Grant: The CIWB was awarded a planning grant for the Healthcare HUBs Grant. The CIWB will be working with CCCC, MassHire Cape & Islands Career Center and Greater NB Workforce Board. Additionally Duffy Health Center and Outer Cape Health Services are noted employer partners.

Learn to Earn Initiative: The CIWB partnered with UMass Online, MassHire Cape & Islands Career Center, Cape Cod Community College and the Wampanoag Tribe to submit an application for the Learn to Earn Grant. The Learn to Earn Initiative (LTE), is designed by the EOLWD, as a comprehensive approach to providing individuals who are receiving assistance from public benefit programs with the supports, skills and credentials they need to gain and retain employment in occupations for which employers have persistent demand. These programs will help participants set and achieve goals necessary for employment and economic stability. Awardees should be notified in mid-November.

UMDI Strategic Plan: The CIWB was recently awarded 30K to continue their work on revising the Regional Blueprint. This will include continued work with UMDI, prioritizing occupations, analyzing the data and impacts of COVID, continuing to leverage local and state grants to help grow the CIWB programs and to help initiate short and long term goals.

Mass Online Marketing Plan: UMass Online will being doing a three part series on the work that UMDI, UMass Online, CIWB and the MassHire system are doing together on the Regional Blueprint. This work is even more critical now, as we are on the road to recovery. Phase One of this series will launch in mid-October.

Competitive Selection of the Career Center Operator/Service Provider: Diane Hurley spoke to the process and answered questions regarding the process. The Executive Director had asked all of those individuals who may be interested in applying to please step off the call (Kris Dower excused herself from this discussion).

Kara and Chris Richards both took the time to acknowledge Bev Horan, as this was her last CIWB BOD, she retired over the summer and was looking forward to spending time with her family. Bev was a long term member of the CIWB BOD, additionally she was involved in the CIWB Youth Council, CIWB Human Resource Committee and CIWB Age Forward Committee. Bev has participated in and attended countless events she will certainly be missed, however we wish her well.

Connecting Activities Q1 Report

July 1, 2020 - September 30, 2020

The CIWB in partnership with the regions nine partner schools will prioritize the following throughout the upcoming academic year:

- Expansion of the Innovation Pathway Program; the CIWB is currently working with Dennis-Yarmouth School district on their application, the CIWB is also on the advisory board at BHS with their Innovation Pathway (business)
- Continue to provide career awareness education, exploration and immersion experiences for students in a safe in-person environment or virtually
- Continue to utilize social media platforms and newly created CIWB YouTube Channel to enhance programmatic design and bring awareness to program.
- Promote STEM education and career awareness, as well as priority sectors within the region and continue to bring awareness to the Regional Blueprint
- Promote Work-Based Learning Tool

Narrative:

Financial Literacy Tool Kit: The CIWB will be launching their new Personal Financial Literacy Toolkit during STEM Week. This toolkit is an online guided instruction that consists of three interactive modules. Each of the modules explore the concepts of financial literacy. Students in grades 9 through 12 will participate in this toolkit to enhance their knowledge of personal finance education. The toolkit can be completed individually by a young adult or as an addition to an educators instruction. Activities included in the modules support English Language Arts, Math, Social Studies and Economics. The learning modules also align with High Schools standards for Personal Financial Literacy (HHS.PFL).

Artworks Program: As with many programs, the program design will be changing for the upcoming academic year. During July & August a group of artist mentors, administrators and CIWB staff convened to design the ArtWorks Program. The ArtWorks Program which is entering its 24th year, will continue to provide career awareness within the arts. Although the model will be different, we are confident the program will be successful, to ensure we are meeting the needs of all involved we are offering a hybrid approach; virtual mentorship, in-person internship (seniors only), a hybrid approach and lastly artistic modules that can be saved to the CIWB YouTube page. The culmination of the ArtWorks Program has always been the exhibit season which has been launched annually at the onsite gallery at Cape Cod Community College. However, due to the pandemic the exhibit will be held on a virtual platform.

CIWB Youth Council: Although not required by WIOA, the CIWB has a long history of providing robust and meaningful internships to high school juniors and seniors on Cape Cod. During their internships students participate in monthly CIWB Youth Council meetings, attend regional activities and also meet with their peers to facilitate a

STEM Week: With our regional work with the STEM network, we were aware that STEM week, was going to be held virtually. With many of our Connecting Activities partners embracing innovation and technology it was critical to ensure the region took part in this event. Planning events that raise awareness for STEM education and employment via a virtual platform, allowed us the CIWB to be creative. The CIWB will be hosting three events during STEM week: an interview with Amanda Hough, STEM Teacher of the Year & a Teacher at Mashpee Middle/High School, a STEM Career Panel with local regional experts and lastly we will be launching our Financial Literacy Tool kit. "See Yourself In STEM", is a theme in which we are embracing.

CIWB Social Media Platforms: The CIWB launched new social media platforms during the summer to assist in highlighting and promoting the Connecting Activities Program. We launched a CIWB YouTube Channel, Instagram, Facebook and Linkedin. Additionally we launched a new newsletter using Constant Contact which allows us to better target and personalize content, and also allows us to build better brand recognition, which as been exceedingly important as we have created a newsletter for our Young Adult Programs and our "Adult" Programs.

In preparation for migrating our programs to a virtual model, we spent a significant amount of time updating our website. (which is a work in progress).

UMass Marketing/UMass Online: The CIWB has been working with UMDI on updating the Regional Blueprint, as a result, UMass marketing has taken the opportunity to highlight the partnership between the organizations. www.umassonline.net/blog/regional-workforce. This four part series will also highlight the services the CIWB provides to young adults and the collaborative partnerships we have developed.

Focus Topic:

The CIWB is in the process of working with UMDI to update and redefine our Regional Blueprint, this work includes examining our priority sectors and occupations. The healthcare industry will continue to be one of our regions fastest growing sectors through 2029, despite the impact of COVID-19. We have also updated the sector to Technology (to include IT, CyberSecurity; Engineering; Manufacturing; R&D). The Blue Economy is vitally important to the region as we are largely surrounded by water. The economic security of the Cape and Islands region relies on viable and sustainable water resources.
